Time for Church

Back by popular demand --- **the 9:30 service at Trinity**. While it's not quite early enough for our former "8 o'clockers" and a bit too early for our "10 o'clockers," it's a compromise and with a few exceptions (i.e., your editor), the vote to make the time change was overwhelmingly in favor.

How many Sunday mornings would some of us like to stay tucked in bed or curled up in a cozy chair with the paper and just skip church for the week? Often, certainly at this time of year. However, being a Christian means being in community, means being fed together to strengthen us to be Christ to the world. As Eucharistic Prayer C reads, "Deliver us from the presumption of coming to this Table for solace only, and not for strength; for power only and not for compassion; for pardon only and not for renewal."

You may remember that the Canons of the Episcopal Church state, "All persons within this church shall celebrate and keep the Lord's Day, commonly called Sunday, by regular participation in the public worship of the church, by hearing the Word of God read and taught, and by other acts of devotion and works of charity ..."

However, it's not always possible, so here is a list of excuses, offered with tongue firmly in cheek, for the Sundays you just can't quite make it:

- Church is too early
- Church is too late
- The sermon is too short
- The sermon is too long
- There's too much music
- There's not enough music
- The pews are hard (well, okay, they are)
- The church is too cold
- The church is too hot
- The kids don't want to get up (do they have a choice on school mornings?)
- I don't want to get up

These are favorites that have been heard here and elsewhere:

- I forgot to change the clocks (only valid twice a year)
- I got up and got ready, but fell asleep on the couch (originated by Bob England)
- I couldn't find my car keys
- Someone might see me there
- Sunday morning is my spiritual time and church really messes that up
- I'm too well to go to church today
- I went to church last week
- I'd rather go to St. Mattress on Sundays

Feel free to add your favorites ... but try not to use them too often. Make time for church. You'll find the time you spent worshipping with your church family will come back to you over and over throughout the week when you need it most.

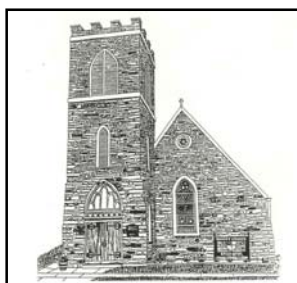
