Last Pentecost - First Advent - November - 2008

Greetings,

As the weather is predicted to turn to snow, we all start battening down the hatches and planning for the long winter ahead. I always find this a sort of comforting time. A time that not only calls for us to plan for the impending winter but gives us some down time to gather our thoughts and consider where our energy should be directed in the upcoming weeks.

We always dread a winter storm but it's interesting how those storms bring out in us a sort of adventurer. For some of us it brings back memories of days when electric and indoor plumbing was a luxury.

Imagine, the computer and the television being "down" for several days. What *would* we do? For me, I get a little "squirrely" this time of year. Early Winter Book Study

We've talked a lot (Trula in sermons, Vestry at meetings, you all at home, I hope) about how we can develop a better understanding of people in our community who aren't necessarily like us and how we can, through that understanding, make them feel welcome at Trinity. We're taking a step toward that goal by planning a book study in January.

We've chosen *Coming Out, an Act of Love*, a book that was recommended by The Rev. T. Scott Allen. This short volume, by clinical psychologist Rob Eichberg, discusses the various aspects of the coming out process and the effects on all of the participants in that difficult and often painful undertaking. One reviewer said that the book is "...filled with compassion, understanding, and empathy for those who are coming out, as well as for those to whom the coming out process is directed," while another described "Coming Out" as "...center[ing] on the individual but understand[ing] that one person's actions of self-respect and love can begin to change the world."

We're planning the book study for Sunday evenings at 7:00 pm in the Parish Hall starting January 11 and we'll have more details soon. Plan to join us. We might not change the world, but we might very well change our view of it! And we also might have a chance to show Trinity's best side to some folks who may not have expected to be welcomed into our family.

With great joy we welcome Marie Bubniak and Karen Nichols to the Vestry. They are both interested and involved in our life at Trinity and we thank them for offering to serve.

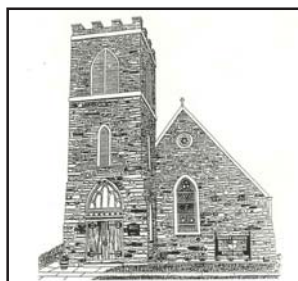
Rector's Discretionary Fund
