Trinity has always designated the first Sunday of the month as Food Bank Sunday. Everyone has always been most generous. Since the beginning of this year, we collect food every Sunday.

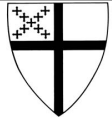
I ask that we remember this, but that we also consider what else we, as a church and as individuals, can do to feed the stomachs, hearts and souls of the people in our valley.

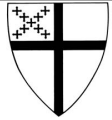

From Canon Bill Lewellis ...

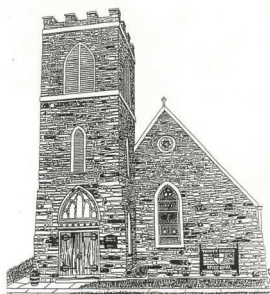
